1. Stallion 3 yo and over (Stallions must be adequately bitted)
 2. Gelding 4 yo and over
 3. Yeld mare 4 yo and over (competing in Section II)
 4. Veteran pony, 16 yo and over on day of show
 5. Yeld mare 4 yo and over (not competing in Section II)
 6. Mare with foal at foot
 7. Foal
 8. 3 yo filly or gelding
 9. 2 yo colt, filly or gelding (2yr old colts must be bitted)
 10. 1 yo colt, filly or gelding

18. Working Harness (Deer Panniers or Any other Traditional Working Harness)

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Health & Safety. As Duthie Park is a public space with many visitors, Aberdeen City Council seek to restrict the movement of vehicles, all show vehicles must therefore be parked within the show perimeter before 10am and cannot leave the show field until after 3pm. Gates to Show field will be closed during this period and emergency entry/exit only allowed under supervision of a Show Steward by arrangement with Show Secretary.
- Entry/Exit only by Great Southern Road gates, open from 7.30-10.00am and 3.00-4.30pm.
- Car parking is not allowed on the show field – all cars must be parked within the Public car parks accessed from Riverside Drive or Polmuir Road.
- Please note Entry Numbers to be collected on the day.
- No acknowledgement of Entries without SAE.
- Food, Refreshments and Toilets available on showground.
- Trophies won in 2008 to be returned to the Show Secretary by 4 August 2009.
- Entries close 8 August 2009. No late or telephone entries will be accepted.

RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Please read these – your completed entry form denotes your agreement.

1. Competition is open.
2. Only Registered Highland ponies or their progeny can be entered for any competition.
3. Entry fees are not refundable unless the show is cancelled. All entries must be accompanied by the appropriate fee and completed entry form. No telephone entries/substitution/transfer or nomination entries allowed.
4. No animal suffering from any infectious disease will be allowed to compete and must be removed if stewards so direct.
5. Stock must be *bona fide* property of the exhibitor.
6. The NESHPEs Show Committee shall not be liable for any damage or loss to person, animals or property that exhibitors or public may sustain at the show. It shall be deemed a condition of entry that each entrant agrees to indemnify the organisers against any legal action arising and that they have public liability insurance for their livestock.
7. Protests, along with £20 (which will be forfeited if protest is dismissed) must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, within 30 minutes of completion of the judging of that particular class.
8. Stock must be in the showground one hour before judging is due to begin.
9. Competitors entering more than one class accept the risk that timing may conflict.
10. The Show Committee has the right to combine/cancel classes due to lack of numbers/weather conditions.
11. The decision of the Show Committee and/or Judge shall be final on all matters regarding the show.
12. No Highland pony bred by, ever owned by, or produced by the judge may enter.
13. Behaviour by any exhibitor deemed unsporting or unreasonable by the Show Committee may cause all rosettes, prizes and monies due to be forfeited.
14. Competitors MUST WEAR HARD HATS up to current BSI Standard at all times while riding ponies on the showground.
15. No dung to be left on field, competitors must remove in bags provided.
16. Ridden classes, only one groom per pony allowed in ring.
17. No spurs to be allowed.
18. Canes/Whips must not exceed 75cms.
19. Any animal that constitutes a danger will be asked to leave the ring/show field.
20. No Pony may enter the ring after the judging process has begun and the Steward has closed the ring.
21. Health and Safety. The Organisers have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the Health & Safety of everyone present. To ensure these measures are effective, everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid accidents occurring and must obey the directions of organisers, officials and stewards.
22. Passport must accompany pony to the show and be made available for inspection if required by official.
23. No lunging or long reining of ponies allowed on the show field (other than as part of Class 18). Pony to be under direct control of handler at all times whilst moving around show field.
